emergency shelter and transitional housing programs; a 24-hour domestic violence crisis hotline; legal support services; and counseling and community education programs. Laura's House provides domestic violence education, prevention, shelter and counseling services to Southern California residents.

Also Viejo-based semiconductor and system-solutions provider **Microsemi**

**Corp.** donated \$1 million to support **Chapman University's** Center for Science and Technology. Opening in fall 2018, the center will be part of Chapman's Schmid College of Science and Technology. It will feature a Microsemi Teaching Electronics Laboratory and a Microsemi Software Engineering Laboratory. Over the past few years, the university has created the Crean College of Health and Behavioral Sciences and opened a new health science campus in Irvine as well as Orange County's first pharmacy school.

Starting Labor Day weekend, 20 local architectural, engineering, planning and design teams will come together for the annual **Construction** design-build competition at **South Coast Plaza**. The event, which falls in conjunction with the Festival of Children, will have 14 structures throughout the mall. Construction showcases structures made out of canned food. After the structures are built and put on display, all the food gets donated to local hunger-relief organizations.
