After an al fresco cocktail hour with hors d'oeuvres provided by Fig and Olive, and a silent auction, the moon rose as guests made their way into a decorated tent to enjoy a three-course meal prepared by Pelican Hill, followed by a live auction and a multi-media program highlighting CCA's successes throughout the year and a sneak peek into future initiatives.

Grammy Award-winner David Foster's newest protégé, jazz singer Brenna Whitaker, provided the evening's entertainment.
